Four Tryon people were injured in an auto-bus collision on Sunday evening about 6:30 a few miles north of Hendersonville when an auto headed toward Asheville collided with a truck that was in front of the bus headed toward Tryon. The local people injured coming home were Mr. and Mrs. Jack Gaze, Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Turner and Mr. Gaze's brother, T. R. Gaze of Asheville who was coming here for a visit.

Robert Settles, of Hendersonville, an occupant of the truck, was

killed.

Mr. Gaze stated that when the bus collided with the truck, the seats were thrown upside down and the passengers sent hurling to the front and piled up. While injuries received by local people are not serious, they were peinful.
