The following weather report for the year as tabulated by the official weatherman, Observer W. W. Brasman is very interesting and shows in cold figures why Tryon has the best year 'round climate. Not many very cold days and only a few hot ones. It is just right to live in and enjoy life. Just enough disagreeable days to appreciate the many good ones. The report is as follows:

Average temperature for Year:
January 41.5; February 44.6;
March 56.6; April 58.9; May 65.8;
June 76.5; July 76.1; August 74.4;
September 68.9; October 59.8; November 53.6 December 37.1.

Departure from Normal: January .1; February .1; March .3; April .3; May .8; June 3.6; July .3; August 1.8; September 2.6; October 1.3; November 3.1; Dec. 6.5.

Precipitation: January 7.03; February 3.47; March 4.39; April 3.39; May 4.10; June 2.78; July 3.00; August 10.46; September 5.55; October 1.20; November 5.45; December 2.98.

Departure from Normal: January 2.; February 1.90; March .73; April .03; May 1.11; June 1.70; July 2.13; August 5.41; September 2.21; October 3.07; November 2.05; December 2.17.

Clear or Mostly Clear Days:
January 16; February 19; March 19; April 18; May 21; June 27; July 20; August 22; September 22; Oct. 28; Nov. 28; Dec. 22.

Average temperature for year: 59.8, departure from normal .4.

Total precipitation for year: 57.70; departure from normal 1.41.

Total, clear or mostly clear days: 256—(71% of all days of year).
