Dear Mr. Vining,

It is quite probable that I, who today have practically impaled myself on the Square railings trying to smell our almond tree, will tomorrow be hurrying to the country to dig lambkins out of the snow! However, while it lasts, the weather we are having is extraordinarily nice.

Mrs. Grenfell and I motored into the country on Sunday, while Mr. Grenfell and Mr. Thomas Phipps, who is over here now, played golf. Unlike the trees, which are still bare and brown, my fellow-motorists were as green as Ireland's greenest grass. This is the month when new driving licenses are taken out, and old ones are renewed. Coupled with a feeling of Spring in the air and general joie de vivre, Sunday's drivers were full of the quaintest ideas, all of them definitely menacing to Mrs. Grenfell and myself.
