Washington, May 11.—J. Edgar Hoover announced tonight arrest of Thomas H. Robinson, Jr., sought for the kidnaping of Mrs. Alice Speed Stoll, of Louisville, Ky. He was captured at Glendale, Calif.

Mrs. Stoll was kidnaped on October 10, 1934.

Hoover said Robinson admitted his identity when captured at about 10:30 p. m. (E. S. T.) tonight and was immediately started for Louisville.
