Funeral services were to be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Mill Spring Baptist church for Horace Waldrop, 23 of East Flat Rock who with 14 others was seriously injured Saturday afternoon when a truck carrying a load of picnickers overturned between Columbus and Mill Spring while enroute to Lake Adger.
