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# Farmers Making Heavy Payments On Their Loans

The Federal Land Bank of Colambia announces that for every \$1.00 due the government in August on loans made to farmers, the bank collected \$6.57, showing that the farmers in North and South Carolina, Georgia and Florida are eager to pay up their indebtedness ahead of time. In August the amount falling due in North Carolina was \$13,798.78. The amount collected was \$137,1 506.98. Some of it was past due insta!lments showing that the farmers took advantage of the higher farm prices. In the four states \$104,691.55 fell due in Aug. and the amount collected \$687,488.25. From May 1, 1933, to July 1, 1936, Polk county received \$121,890 in Federal loans.
