### P.-T. A. Holds First Meeting on Monday

The Tryon Parent-Teacher Association held its first meeting of the new session on Monday afternoon at the school auditorium with the new President, Dr. Blanche Elfrink, presiding. Dr. Elfrink gave an interesting account of her recent trip to California and of the P.-T. A. she visited there. Mrs. S. C. Dailey spoke of the relation of the County Nurses to the school children and suggested that a pre-school age clinic be held in order to prevent diseases from getting into the school. Supt. W. A. Schilleter stated that the congestion in the second grade was terrible where 91 pupils are being taught by only two teachers. He said that it would be necessary to rearrange this grade so that half the pupils would come in the morning and half in the afternoon. Miss Evelyn Carruth of Landrum was welcomed as a new teacher in the school. Following the business session members repaired to the cafeteria for a reception for the new teacher and new parents. ### W. N. C. Democratic Executives Met In Asheville, Mon.

Two hundred Western North Carolina Democrats, meeting in caucus with state officials at the county courthouse Monday afternoon, heard county chairmen from the 13 counties in the 11th congressional district pledge themselves to a determined effort to set up precinct organizations that will bring in a Democratic majority in the November 3 election which would surpass the 25,000 majority polled in the party in 1932.

State Democratic Chairman J. Wallace Winborne, of Marion, presiding, strongly urged the county party officials to "know your precinct." "Make a poll of every voter in it to find out your possible strength and then check your lists against the registration to see that all Democrats are registered. And finally," he continued, "be sure that all of them vote on election day."
