G. G. Burlingame, 51, Executive, Is Dead

Winter Resident of Tryon

Sherbrooke, Que., Oct. 26. (Canadian Press).—Geoffrey Gordon Burlingame of Syracuse and Cazenovia. N. Y., died here vesterday.

Mr. Burlingame, who arrived in
Sherbrooke Friday, was stricke with a heart attack. He was 51
years old. The body has been talen to Cazenovia for burial.

Mr. Burlingame was the founder and president of Burlingam, King & Dunk, Inc., 45 West Fortyfith Street agricultural engineer. In recent years he had reside during the summer at Cazenovia, N. Y., in the winter at Tryon, N. C. Besides his widow, Lucy Tatum Burlingame, and his daughter, Catherine, he is survived by two brothers, Roedrick S. of Syracuse, and Bruce Burlingame of Cazenovia.

On graduating from the Corne'l Agr'cultural college in 1907 Mr. Burlingame bought a farm at Cazenovia and later entered the business of farm management. His operations included farms in cost of the Eastern states and for some years the supervision of plantations in Hawaii. He belonged to the Chi Phi fraternity.

Two months ago Mr. Burlingame suffered a heart attack and was advised to lessen his activities.
