## G. G. Burlingame, 51, Executive, Is Dead

### Winter Resident of Tryon

Sherbrooke, Que., Oct. 26. (Canadian Press).—Geoffrey Gordon Burlingame of Syracuse and Cazenovia, N. Y., died here yesterday.

Mr. Burlingame, who arrived in Sherbrooke Friday, was stricken with a heart attack. He was 51 years old. The body has been taken to Cazenovia for burial.

Mr. Burlingame was the founder and president of Burlingame, King & Dunk, Inc., 45 West Forty-fifth Street, agricultural engineer. In recent years he had resided during the summer at Cazenovia, N. Y., in the winter at Tryon, N. C. Besides his widow, Lucy Tatum Burlingame, and his daughter, Catherine, he is survived by two brothers, Roedrick S. of Syracuse, and Bruce Burlingame of Cazenovia.

On graduating from the Cornell Agricultural college in 1907 Mr. Burlingame bought a farm at Cazenovia and later entered the business of farm management. His operations included farms in most of the Eastern states and for some years the supervision of plantations in Hawaii. He belonged to the Chi Phi fraternity.

Two months ago Mr. Burlingame suffered a heart attack and was advised to lessen his activities.
