A Letter From Far Away Denmark

S. S. Hengist
Oct 23, 1936.

(Mailed from Copenhagen
Denmark).

Dear Seth,

I never think of Tryon without being overpowered by a huge yen to return.

I am starting a trip around the world which will last nearly a year and it would be difficult for, even your versatile Bulletin to follow me. We have spent the past 3 weeks motoring thru England, Ireland and Scotland and at the moment are crossing the North Sea to Copenhagen. From there to Norway, Sweden, Finland and Russia; thence back thru Poland to Germany and Austria, south to Switzerland, Italy, Greece, Egypt and the Holy Land then thru the Suez to India, Ceylon, Siam, Java, Bali, China, the Philippines, Japan, Hawaii and home.
