Tryon-Saluda Team Defeats Greenville

The Tryon-Saluda football team recovered their winning stride yesterday and downed the hard fighting Greenville (S. C.) team by the score of 33 to 12. It was not until the second half that the local team started a strong offensive in the air and on the ground and turned the game into a rout. The Greenville school presented one of the best teams seen here. Their blocking, tackling, plays, and spirit deserve the highest praise. Tryon did not score until a few minutes before the first half when a pass and fake brought the first touchdown. Staton, big driving back made the extra point and Tryon-Saluda had a seven point lead at the half. In the third quarter, Tryon took complete charge of the game and in rapid succession rang up three touchdowns. All the backs, Staton, Blackwell, Jones, Fox, Miller, Eaton and Foster contributed brilliant runs to pile up the score. The Greenville team pushed over two touchdowns by clever cut backs off tackle. The presence of Heatherly, giant Saluda tackle, was sorely missed. Due to an attack of "flu", he had to watch the game from the sidelines.

In the closing minutes of the game, Fox made the prettiest run of the game when he took a pass from Blackwell on the fifty yard line and reversed his field several times and crossed the goal standing up. R. Green turned in another good game in his punting and play on end. Parker, Chap-
