Turkey Day In The U. S. Army

Seventy thousand turkeys, 450 tons of them, will be set before the khaki-clad nephews of Uncle Samuel on Thanksgiving Day, when both the Regular Army and the CCC boys put on their best bibs and tuckers for the holiday feasting.

But the 901,000 pounds of turkey which will be roasted to a golden brown, bulging with chestnut dressing, is only a starter on the Thanksgiving Day dinners that the Army will put on the tables for the boys.

Here's how the 22nd Infantry at Fort McPherson will tease their appetites and test their capacities:

First with branch celery, stuffed olives, head lettuce, sliced tomatoes, sweet mixed pickles.

Then the turkey, which must be young and prime, with giblet gravy, chestnut dressing and cranberry sauce.

For more hardy souls, there will come then a barbecue loin of pork, candied sweet potatoes, creamed mashed potatoes, Parker House rolls, asparagus tips on toast.

Having become thoroughly wound up about this time, the soldiers will start on mince pie, pumpkin pie, English plum pudding with hard sauce.

An interlude with grapes, oranges, bananas and apples will follow, after which dessert will be served, which will include chocolate layer cake, and ice cream. Coffee or sweet milk accompanies the dinner.
