A telegram received this morning from National Red Cross headquarters in Washington says: "Admiral Grayson congratulates the Polk County Chapter on its splendid achievement in behalf of Red Cross Flood Relief Fund. Needs continue to grow. Red Cross now caring for nearly million flood refugees in Ohio and Mississipp valleys. Operating 113 field hospitals and 317 concentration camps. Red Cross furnishing immediate emergency relief for refugees. This must continue for many weeks until water has receded. Possibility additional towns must be evacuated and number of refugees will grow. National chairman hopes citizens of your chapter will continue to respond to fullest extent their generosity."
