Tilley Accepts Call to Church at Columbus

Columbus, Feb. 12.—The Rev. G. V. Tilley, formerly of Morganton, has accepted a call to the Columbus - Mill Spring Baptist churches.

Dr. Tilley is a graduate of the University of North Carolina and of the Southern Baptist Theological seminary, Louisville, Ky.

His wife is an accomplished musician who studied at the Baltimore Conservatory of music and taught in Louisburg college, Louisburg, N. C.

Dr. Tilley accepted the call following the resignation of the Rev. Charles B. Trammel about two months ago. He and Mrs. Tilley moved to Columbus on Wednesday and he will deliver his first sermon here on Sunday.—Asheville Citizen.
