Kiwanis Official At Club Meeting

Lieut-Gov. R. E. Price of Division One of the Carolinas Kiwanis District was the chief speaker at the Tryon Kiwanis club meeting on Tuesday at 1 p. m., at Hotel Tryon. The speaker outlined the principles and objectives of Kiwanis International:

To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to material values of life.

To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.

To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business, and professional standards.

To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.

To provide through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.

To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good will.

An interesting feature of the meeting was the presentation of Dr. C. Arthur Lincoln as a new member of the club by Carroll P. Rogers, past president and former lieutenant governor, who ably expressed the meaning and work of Kiwanis.
