## McDowell Introduces Another Madison Bill

According to the Asheville Citizen this morning Representative T. J. McDowell of Polk county has introduced in the legislature "upon request" of the Democratic organization of Madison county, a bill to fix the salary of the county auditor of Madison county at \$1,800 a year, and tax manager at \$2,000 a year. Madison county has a duly elected representative but he is a Republican, and the Democrats don't want him to represent. It is rumored that certain Democratic leaders not only believe in the use of absentee ballots but also in absentee representatives, in spite of the fact that this country was founded in opposition to the "taxation without representation" policy of absentee rulers in England. Old time Democrats believed in states rights and local self government. In addition to their duly elected representative (Republican), Madison county Democrats have a lobbyist in W. K. McLean, former senator from Polk county who now lives in Madison county. Mr. McLean has been a regular attendant at the legislature.
