Attention Mr. G. H. Holmes:

It is true that an ordinance was passed by the Town Commissioners in 1927 setting the salary of the Mayor of the Town of Tryon at \$50 a month.

If you will examine the records of Town of Tryon you will find that four years ago by mutual consent of the Mayor and the Commissioners this amount was reduced to \$25 a month. Deduct from this COURT COSTS AND THE NET AMOUNT PAID OUT OF THE TREASURY IS APPROXIMATE-LY \$15 a month. Is this an excessive amount for the responsibility of an office representing an investment of over a million and one half dollars?

Water rates may seem high but debts accumulated in previous administrations have to be paid.

Tryon is noted for meeting all its obligations, never having missed meeting a payment when due.

If you will examine the Treasuer's books of the Town of Tryon you will find the Water Department has always been kept separate from the General Fund. For definite information of matters concerning the Town consult the Town Manager who is in position to give you accurate information and extremely anxious to do so.
