

Tryon-Saluda Dist. Vote 9 Mo. School

Tryon and Saluda townships voted Tuesday by a big majority to have a nine months school term for the Tryon-Saluda school district which includes the schools of Tryon, Saluda and Lynn. Out of 409 registered to vote in Tryon township 296 voted in favor of the nine months term to 22 against it. In Saluda township out of 156 registered, 105 voted for the measure to 18 against it. A number of people failed to vote and many were out-of-town. An encouraging spirit for education was the fact that so many people who own property and have no children voted for the measure.

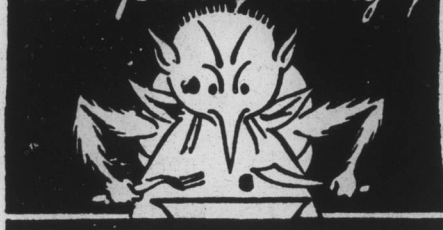
