# Polk Is First To Make Report To State Board

Raleigh, June 10.—Polk county has the distinction of being the first county in North Carolina to report the appointment of a full-time superintendent of public welfare by the county commissioners and the county board of public welfare meeting in joint session, according to Mrs. W. T. Bost, state commissioner of charities and public welfare.

Polk is one of the 17 counties in the state where the superintendent of schools has been serving as welfare officer ex-officio, but in accordance with recent social security legislation, it becomes mandatory to have a fulltime superintendent of public welfare.

Miss Rebecca Hoskins, certifying case worker in Polk county during the last 18 months, has been appointed to the superintendency of public welfare in Polk county. She is well qualified to serve in this capacity, having received her B. A. degree, majoring in sociology at the woman's college of the University of North Carolina.

Her training in an accredited school of public administration, University of North Carolina, and six months in the Pennsylvania school of social work. She has had four years of successful experience in social work as case worker with the FRA and certifying case worker, State board of charities and public welfare.
