Sain Rites To Be Held Today

Mill Spring, N. C., June 19.—Funeral services for Monroe L. Sain, 43, constable and school bus driver of the Silver Creek church community who died this morning near Asheville from injuries received in a truck wreck yesterday, will be held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the Silver Creek Baptist church. The Rev. Mr. Strickland will officiate, and interment will be in the church cemetery.

Sain's truck, according to information reaching here, crashed when a cow which he was hauling jumped from the vehicle about five miles above Fletcher on the Hendersonville-Asheville highway.

He was born and reared in McDowell county but had made his home in the Silver Creek church community for approximately 25 years. He was a deacon of that church.

Surviving are his wife; four sons, Jesse, Walter, Doyle and Lloyd Sain; three daughters, Gertrude, Dorothy and Viola Sain; and two brothers, J. A., and W. S. Sain.—Spartanburg Herald.
