A London Letter From Mrs. Flynn

June 19, 1937.

Dear Mr. Vining:

We have done and seen so much since we arrived in England, that I am afraid that I have been very bad about writing to my friends in Tryon.

During the Coronation procession I kept thinking of you all and wished the whole thing was happening at Harmon Field or marching up Trade Street. It was all like a wonderful dream, and one that we shall never forget. Of course this is the best time of the year to be in England, there is so much happening.

The Derby, England's greatest flat race, was rather a disappointment to us all because my brother-in-law, Lord Astor, again, had the favorite in his horse Cash Book and again did not win. He has been second five times third once and favored to win eight times since the war. However, there is another year coming. The military tournament is just over at Olympia, and the International Horse Show starts there to-day. The great Ascot race meeting finished yesterday, and it is I think the four greatest racing days in the world. The King and Queen attended each day this year. The international tennis tournament at Wimbledon begins next week. I think the turf courts at Wimbleson are supposed to be the finest anywhere. Lefty went to the Royal Tatoo Friday night.
