

## B. S. Board to Meet At Piedmont Camp

Tryon, N. C., July 19th.—The Executive Board of the Piedmont Council, Boy Scouts of America, Inc., representing the counties of Gaston, Cleveland, Lincoln, Rutherford, Polk, Iredell. Alexander, Caldwell, Catawba, Burge and Mc. Dowell will meet at the Piedmont Boy Scout camp at Lake Lanier on Sunday morning, Juy 25th, at which time an inspection of the new development of the camp will be made and the business of the organization will be transacted.

The meeting will open at 10:30 o'clock with a church service conducted by Judge Bismark Capps of Gastonia, who is president of the Piedmont Council. Following the service a business meeting will be held and an inspection of the camp will be made. The camp has been greatly enlarged, some 35 acres have been added to the site and many improvements have been made making it possible for the camp to accommodate 160 campers each week. From 1,300 to 1,400 different Scouts will be served by the camp this summer. Members of the Board will be entertained at dinner at one o'clock.
