## SOME JOB

A number of people have asked the editor of the Bulletin from time to time this question, "What does Miss Rebecca Hoskins do?" Miss Hoskins is the County Superintendent of public welfare, and Mrs. W. T. Bost, the State Commissioner, through Mrs. W. B. Aycock, Division Director, has given the following outline of Miss Hoskins' duties:

"The county superintendent of public welfare shall be chief school attendance officer of the county, and shall have other duties and powers as follows:

"To have, under control of the county commissioners, the care and supervision of the poor, and to administer the poor funds.

"To act as agent of the State Board in relation to any work to be done by the State Board within the county.

"To look after and keep up with the condition of persons discharged from hospitals for the insane and from other state institutions.

"To have oversight of prisoner in the county on parole from penitentiaries, reformatories, and all parole prisoners in the county.

"To have oversight of dependent and delinquent children, and especially those on parole or probation.

"To promote wholesome recreation in the county and to enforce such laws as regulate commercial amusement.

"To have oversight over dependent children placed in the county by the state board.

"To assist the state board in
