Polk Man Injured In Mine Explosion

Pat Kirkland, 52, of Mill Spring, in Mission hospital, Asheville, suffering from a broken leg and abdominal injuries as the result of an explosion in the Mine Hole Gap rock quarry about 7:00 o'clock Tuesday morning near Asheville. One man from Tennessee was killed and two others injured by the same explosion. The men were using dynamite in their work.
