John Ferguson

Funeral services for John R. Ferguson, well-known Tryon architect, who died at his home on Sunday afternoon at 4 o'clock, will be conducted this afternoon (Monday) in Spartanburg at the Church of the Advent, Episcopal, by the rector, the Rev. W. H. K. Pendleton, and the Rev. John A. Pinckney, rector of the Church of the Holy Cross, Tryon. Interment will follow in the church cemetery.

Mr. Ferguson had been in ill health for sometime, but his sudden death came as a shock to many friends throughout this section. He was a member of the Rotary club and the Tryon Country club. As an architect, a number of outstanding buildings in this section will remain as monuments to his work, among the latest being the Gertrude Holbrook Hardin Memorial nurses' home at St. Luke's hospital.

Mr. Ferguson was born in Mount Pleasant, S. C., in 1898, the son of the late Charles B. and Clara R. Ferguson. He attended the Charleston high school and Clemson college.

After graduation from college, he entered the architectural profession, and was at various times located in Spartanburg, Greenville, Asheville and Tryon.

In 1927, he was married to Miss Ella T. Lindsay of Spartanburg. He is survived by his wife; two children, Wilton L. and Charlotte B. Ferguson; a sister, Mrs. John B. Barrow, of Charleston; and
