From China

Rev. and Mrs. Rolla Dyer have received the following letter from their son, Rev. Edward Dyer, who is an Episcopal missionary in China. Mr. Dyer was here four years ago:

Shanghai, China
Dec. 26, 1937.

Dear Father and Mother:

I sent a letter off to you via Hongkong and Manila and the Clipper across the Pacific some time ago (it never reached Tryon) and now I think I'll try another note and send it that way if I can find a thin envelope around the place.

I am getting on nicely here. The seat of war is now two hundred miles from here at its nearest point or even further and unlikely to get an inch nearer. No travel is yet permitted by our friends across the way, so I can't go back to our town yet.

I am still at the Norton's who are great friends of mine. In 1927 during the great Chinese roughhouse we stayed with them and now during the 1937 roughhouse I am doing it again.

I shall not go back to Wusih this time until I get a pass from the people who are in actual control of the country.
