Letters have been sent out today by a committee of the Polk County Council of Social Agencies to friends of the Helping Hand and the American Women's Hospitals asking financial support of these two welfare agencies. Brief items have been printed in the Bulletin lately as to the nature of some of the work of these organizations. The American Women's Hospitals, with Dr. John Z. Preston, physician, and Miss Irene Clark, nurse, maintains in three sections of the county three free clinics for maternity cases, including pre-natal and post-natal care for mothers unable to pay for the attentions of a doctor and a nurse. Incidentally it is also concerned with other health conditions. The Helping Hand is a general welfare society over thirty years old. It believes all kinds of distress in indigent families and attempts to restore independence and self-support to individuals and families who have become dependent. Both of these organizations are doing excellent constructive work which is indispensable. Demands upon them increase day by day and it is hoped that the response to the appeal for financial support will be extra generous. Contributions should be sent to Mrs. John Washburn.
