Among the institutions and organizations which benefit the citizens of Tryon and Polk county, St. Luke's hospital has a unique claim upon their esteem and support. Its service to the community is recognized by the Duke Foundation and by the county, both of which appropriate funds toward its maintenance. To maintain the hospital for the current year, something more than \$6,000 will be required, in addition to the sources of income which have been indicated. During the week commencing March 21st St. Luke's Hospital Association will call upon the citizens of Tryon and Polk county to contribute toward this amount.

NOW, therefore, I, E. E. Missildine, Mayor of Tryon, do hereby designate the week of March 21st as Hospital Week, and commend to all citizens of Tryon the duty and privilege of supporting St. Luke's hospital.
