## Asheville Police Try To Identify Man Found Dead

Asheville, N. C., March 20.—Officers sought today to establish the identity of a well-dressed man whose body was found in a laurel thicket within 200 yards of Beaver Lake clubhouse yesterday. The man apparently had been dead for about two weeks. No marks of violence were found on the body.
