Dental Clinics In Polk Schools

Dr. M. L. Hoffman of Asheville has moved to Columbus and will be associated with the State Board of Health in conducting dental clinics for ten weeks in all the schools of the county, examining students in the first four grades. This will be repeated in three years. The student examined in the first grade will be re-checked by the time he enters the fourth grade. Children needing dental work will be referred to their dentist. Those not able to pay anything will be given free treatment.
