At 3 p. m., this afternoon about 50 people had been killed in the Czech-German fighting. About 200 armed Germans had taken possession of a Czech police station and town. Street fighting and riots continue. Czech government ordered its troops to withdraw from German frontier so that stray bullets would not go into German territory and excite Hitler to march in. Same tactics being used as was used before the Austrian march.
