## Purge Books Of Illegal Voters

## Registration Called Off

A meeting of the Polk County Board of Elections was held at the home of N. G. Walker, mem-ber, at Mill Spring, N. C., Septem-ber 22, 1938, to read a number of letters asking for a purge, among them letters from the chairman of the Democratic Executive Committee of Polk County and from Mrs. George Cathey, member of the State Executive Committee in regard to changing the new regisstration to purging the registration books in the county.

The letters state that the time is too short for a new registration and that the majority of people who asked for the new registration now ask that the books be purged so as to strike off the absentees who have been voting in the county illegally. Mrs. Cathey stated that the Governor has said that he will call for a state-wide reregistration in 1939.

The Board after discussing the matter has decided to call off the new registration in as much as the Governor will call one in 1939 and purge the registration books in each township in the county.

The County Board of Elections will sit with the registrar and judges in each precinct and supervise the purging of the illegal

The purge will begin as soon as possible so as to have the names of the illegal voters stricken off
