Tryon Loses To Hendersonville Team

The Tryon gridders playing superb football for three quarters and held the heavy visitors scoreless until the last period Friday to yield 19 to 0. The locals held the upper edge all through the first half, repulsing every threat and being nine yards from a touchdown with first down and goal to go when the half ended. Hendersonville by means of a forward lateral, cleverly executed over the center of the line, advanced to the twenty yard line. Another series of drives netted ten yards when the third quarter ended. Three thrusts at the line yielded nothing and on the fourth down, a pass out into the flat caught the wing back off guard and a touchdown resulted. The second touchdown came when a Tryon substitute jumped off side and Hendersonville ran a pass play quickly before he could regain his balance. The Tryon team had stopped play but the gain counted when the visitors refused the penalty. The third touchdown resulted in the closing minutes from a blocked kick.

The play of the entire Tryon team for three quarters was excellent but weakened in the final period before the reserve strength and weight of the visitors. The play of Miller and Quarles for Hendersonville stood out. The Tryon team presented a great line with Shields, Heatherly, and Swann stopping one play after another. The Tryon backfield was greatly improved with Green, the outstanding man. His line plunges and passes, racked up consistent gains.
