One Killed And Three Injured In Automobile Accident Saturday

Two persons remained in St. Luke's hospital today following an automobile accident on the Mill Spring-Chesnee highway Saturday night in which Miss Ruth Shields, 24, of the Green Creek section of Polk county, was killed instantly.

Miss Mildred Green, niece of Miss Shields, and James Miller, of Tryon, were admitted to the hospital, suffering severe lacerations and internal injuries. Their conditions were improving today.

A fourth person, Ralph Pack, also of the Green Creek section. was dismissed from the hospital Sunday afternoon.

A jury, impanelled by Dr. John Z. Preston, Polk county coroner, Sunday afternoon returned a verdict that Miss Shields met her death as a result of an "unavoidable accident."

The accident occurred near White Oak Creek in this county bout 10:30 o'clock Saturday night when the car in which Miller. Miss Shields and Miss Green were riding collided with Pack's truck.

A passing motorist stopped at the wreck a few minutes after the collision and found the injured. He was unable to remove the four from the wreckage and went to Mill Spring for help.

Funeral services for Miss Shields a member of a prominent Green Creek family, were conducted at 2 o'clock today (Monday) afternoon at the Green Creek Baptist church by the Rev. N. A. Melton, pastor, and the Rev. T. M. Hester. interment in the church cemetery.
