Stanford Tappan Crapo, born June 13, 1865, at New Bedford, Mass., passed away at Tryon, on January 26, at 10:30 p.m. Funeral services will be held on Sunday at New Bedford.

He is survived by a brother, Henry Howland Crapo, of New Bedford, Mass.; a son, William Wallace Crapo, of Detroit, Mich.; and two daughters, Mrs. John Morgan Bullard, of South Dartmouth, Mass., and Mary Morley Crapo, of Detroit.

Mr. Crapo was a son of the late Congressman William Wallace Crapo of Massachusetts and grandson of Henry Howland Crapo, prominent lumberman and governor of Michigan in 1865. The Crapo family were prominent in the development of Michigan. A cousin, William Crapo Durant, was the founder of the General Motors Corporation.

Mr. Crapo had been coming to Tryon for the past 25 years. He and his wife, the late Emma Morley Crapo who died November 28, 1937, loved Tryon deeply and contributed generously to its many civic causes. A few years ago they built a home here on Melrose Circle and only recently had completed a guest house.

Stanford Tappan Crapo spent his youth in New Bedford, where he attended the Friends Academy. Later he went to Yale University, where he was in the class of '86. At Yale, he was chairman of the Yale News, and a member of the DKE fraternity, and the senior society "Skull and Bones."
