Raleigh, Feb. 1.—The joint Senate and House committees on Unemployment Compensation week considered the amendments to the Unemployment Compensation Law which had been recommended by the State Advisory Council, approved by the Commission, by Washington authorities and by Governor Hoey, and introduced in the General Assembly the week before. Committee members signified their approval of the bil's, when slight changes were made in one section. Senator E. C. Gregory, of Rowan, and Representative R. Gregg Cherry, chairman of Senate and House committees, respectfully, named a sub-committee to make the changes.

The bills provide for "merit rating" or "experience rating" for employer contributions on their payrolls, which looks toward stabilization of employment and rewarding regular and steady employers; for a proper handling of seasonable operations; for appeals of employers from decisions of the Commission to the courts, and oth-

er simplifying amendments.
