Reports are just coming in that four North Carolina dentists and fishing guide were rescued as they clung to the sides of an overturned fishing cruiser off the coast of Florida. The five men were rescued when a party aboard the yacht, Maybick, New York restaurant official, sighted them bobbing in the water. They were given artificial respiration and taken to Craig in the Florida keys. They were reported later to have suffered only from the effects of exposure. The rescue took place on Wednesday but the news was delayed in reaching Miami. The men were Dr. R. R. Howes of For-est City, C. B. Yourg and David Abernathy of Hickory, C. B. Mott of Morganton and Capt. Laverne Sweeting, the guide.
