## Dr. Taylor Urges Normal Course For Sunday School Teachers

In a very interesting talk on "Some Results of Sunday School Surveys" at the Tryon Parent-Teacher Association meeting at the Tryon school on Monday afternoon, Dr. George Farrand Taylor, professor of Biblical Literature at Converse college, urged the establishment of a normal training course for all Sunday school teachers as a vital need to improve the Sunday school work of the county Sunday schools of all denominations. The speaker suggested that the normal could last for about ten Tuesday evenings conducting classes for teachers in each department of the Sunday school, to be followed by a lecture on the Bible after each class session. Plans were discussed for conducting such teachers training school during the coming summer or early in the fall.

A large crowd, including many out-of-town, were present at the meeting and showed interest in the proposed training course. Dr. Taylor organized and for several years conducted successfully the Tryon Boys club during the summer months. He is a member of the Executive Board of the Piedmont Council of Boy Scouts and is Field Commissioner of the Polk County District. He has visited every part of the county making addresses at schools and churches and is deeply interested in the character building organizations of the different communities.
