Hunter Trials Are Seen by Big Crowd

The annual hunter trials, sponsored by the Tryon Hounds, and directed by John R. Kimberly, M. F. H., were held on Wednesday afternoon before a large crowd of interested spectators.

The course, located in the hunting country, was viewed from the Lemort hill.

Judges were Mrs. John L. Grandin, of Boston, Mass., and Henry C. Colt, of Camden, S. C. and Genesco, N. Y.

Horses were shown over several jumps and all the obstacle they might meet in the course of a day's hunting. There were three classes—Junior, senior, and professional, with a large number of horses in each class.

A special feature of the afternoon was a hunt team class, shown following the others, in which the junior team composed of Carter Wilkie Brown, Austin Brown, and Miss Sally Ordway, won first place. Miss Patricia Ferneding, Jack Pierce, and C. O. Alig, Jr., were second.
