Town Election On May 2nd

The Biennial Town Election for Mayor, Town Commissioners, Cemetery Commissioners and for members of the Tryon Special Charter District School Board will be held on Tuesday, May 2nd, at the Town Hall on Maple street. Mayor E. E. Missildine is the only candidate filed for his office. Opposition is found only in the list of names for Town Commissioners where four candidates are applying for three offices and the municipal voters will be compelled to omit at least one name.
