Sawyer Named Head of Polk School System

Columbus, April 26. — Frank Jackson, chairman of the Polk County Board of Education, announced Wednesday the election of Walter E. Sawyer, of Weaverville, to the position of superintendent of schools of Polk county.

He will succeed P. S. White, who has been county superintendent since 1929 and who was not a candidate for reelection.

Mr. Sawyer, principal of the Weaverville high school for the past two years, is a native of South Carolina and a graduate of The Citadel, Charleston, S. C. He has had wide experience in the educational field, having taught in Miami and Bradentown, Fla., and in the states of South Carolina, Georgia and North Carolina.
