A little gain was made in the third when it stood 7-4; another gain in the fifth made it 8-6. Each time Adams-Millis made two runs the visitors made one. The locals gained steadily but the big 6-1 lead of Beaumont in the second was hard to overcome. At the end of the first half of the ninth the South Carolina team was leading 10-8, then Adams-Millis put on the pressure with three runs to capture the game 11-10. A feature of the evening was two home runs made by Holbert for the locals. Culler had a perfect day at bat.
