J. M. Andrews Resigns Post At Columbus School

J. M. Andrews, who has been principal of Stearns high school for seven years, and who was re-elected for the next term, has offered his resignation to the local board and it has been accepted.

Mr. Andrews expects to return to his home in eastern North Carolina where he will supervise his farming and business interests. During his terms here many improvements were made in the physical properties of the school, and it was the unfinished condition of these that prompted him to accept the position for next term. Since then appropriations have been made for completion of the gymnasium and ground beautification. Since the work is under way, he said, he feels that his personal interests will be better served by resigning. No successor has been named.—Asheville Citizen.
