## William A. Dobbyn

William A. Dobbyn, 63, passed away Friday evening about 8:30 at the Spartanburg General hospital illowing a lingering illness. Funer-al services will be held on Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Church of the Holy Cross with the Rev. C. P. Burnett officiating. Interment will follow in the Tryon cemetery. Mr. Dobbyn is survived by his widow, the former Miss Kathleen O'Farrell of Athens, Ga., and one son, William A. Dobbyn, Jr., stu-dent at the Episcopal School,

Alexandria, Va.

Mr. Dobbyn was born at Croton, Ohio, on February 23, 1876. For a number of years he was secretary to James K. Hackett, the famous actor, and later to Levi P. Morton, at one time vice-president of the United States, and was sectary to Col. John Jacob Astor at the time of the sinking of the Titanic. He remained with the Astor family as secretary to Vincent Astor until 14 years ago when he resigned and came to Tryon to live Mr. Astor unon on to live. Mr. Astor, upon learning of Mr. Dobbyn's serious illness, visited him in Tryon about three weeks ago.

Mr. Dobbyn had an interesting career, and made many friends and contacts with noted people all over the world. At one time he was secretary of the Ohio society of New York, and was a member of the Players club of New York. In Tryon, when health permitted, he took an active part in the Drama Fortnightly, the local little theatre.
