spirit of the community to the outside world in her daily news messages.

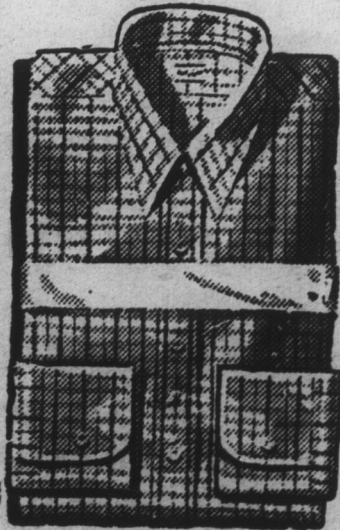
The bridegroom is the son of Mr. Henry Collum of Duluth, Minn., with whom the couple will make their home.
