After the program the pupils will march to their class rooms to receive a schedule of work, book list, lesson assignments and other necessary assignments.

All pupils entering these schools for the first time, except First grade pupils, are asked to please register at the superintendent's office for classification on Friday morning, September 1st, from 10 to 12 o'clock. We wish to have all pupils classified and assigned to grades before school opens.
