Tryon-Saluda Win Over Spartanburg

Tryon-Saluda football team chall d up its second win of the season yesterday when the strong Spartanburg high reserves met defeat 19 to 0. The visitors brought a big crimson and black eleven to Harmon Field which looked like it would swamp the Tryon team during the first few minutes of play. By using a terrific driving attack, combined with clever passing to their big end, Spartanburg soon had the ball on the local's fifteen yard line. They were held for two downs by the Tryon line and then tossed a pass out into the flat which Jones, fleet Tryon quarterback intercepted, and galloped 85 yards to score, outdistanding all pursuars. This was the outstanding run of the entire game. From then on the game was all Tryon's. Just before the first half ended Dutton Beatson raced around end r thirty yards to put the ball the ten yard stripe. The whistle ended this scoring threat with the locals out in front with six points. The Tryon-Saluda eleven received at the beginning of the second half and pounded their way through the Spartanburg line for another tally with Green doing the scoring. The third touchdown came when Jones tossed a pass to Green, who caught it on the twentyfive and side-stepped this way across. Ed Beatson skirted end for the extra point.
