Tryon-Saluda Defeats Welcome 26 to 7

The Tryon-Saluda high football team got revenge for a 12 to 0 licking last year by trouncing the big Welcome high team 26 to 7 in a football game played Friday at Harmon Field. The visitors were outclassed throughout the entire game and made their lone counter in the second period by a succession of passes over the Tryon-Saluda reserve players. The Tryon backfield, consisting of Green, Jones, D. Beatson, Melton, E. Beatson, Holbert and Vining, who took a turn at backfield in the last quarter, gained consistently. The orange clad visitors could not stop Jones and Green on their rushes. The outstanding run of the game was made by Green when he took the ball on an end, run in the second period and streaked fifty yards to score. Jones, playing a jam-up game, made gains every time he had the ball.

The line held its own and checked the Welcome high backs with excellent tackling. McGeachy at center, showed much improvement over past games. The following linemen took part: Wall, Shields, Vining, McGeachy, Rhodes, Swann, Taylor, Cooksey, Chapman, Hilton, Pace, Derby, Parker, Cartee and McFarland.

Touchdowns were made by D. Beatson, Green, Melton and Vining.
