## Mr. Sewall Says:

The Annual Roll Call of the American Red Cross will be held in the United States during the period from November 11 to November 30. A million new members, in addition to the 5,700,000 who enrolled in 1938, will arm the Red Cross to meet the emergencies of the new year. In 1938-39 there were 139 major disasters in this country, in which the Red Cross gave help to more than 100,000 persons, with an expenditure of \$2,605,000. Other aid rendered to persons in distress raised the total spent in this country to \$5,615,000. The Polk County Chapter has been loyally supported during the years past, and hopes to do its part again this year, by a large enrollment.

## H. Lyles, Carpenter Chosen Mayor of Landrum, S. C.

In the Town of Landrum election on Tuesday, H. L. Carpenter was elected mayor in a three-candidate race for that office with 86 votes. Roland L. Lee polled 71 for second high with J. M. Ashmore running in third place.

Frank Lambright, incumbent mayor, was chosen as an alderman along with R. L. Broome, Oscar Brady, A. J. Mitchell. They were elected without opposition. Brady and Mitchell having already served four years as aldermen. Alderman W. S. Heavner did not offer himself for re-election.

Tabulation for alderman showed Brady and Mitchell each received a total of 164 votes, while Broome and Lambright each polled 163.

In the race for water commissioner A. B. Turner, who has been the commissioner for six years, was re-elected, over three opponents, J. E. Ballew, L. L. Hill and Joe Hutchinson.
