Tryon Kiwanians, Rotarians, city officials and county officers have been invited to Chapel Hill to participate in the opening of the Institute of Government laboratory building on Wednesday evening, November 29th. But listen to this bargain: For \$3 they will get three meals including Wednesday evening, Thursday morning and Thanksgiving dinner, a dormitory room to sleep in and a free ticket to the Carolina-Virginia football game. The laboratory is the first of its kind in America, and Speaker W. B. Bankhead and a Congressional delegation will attend the event The public officials of North Carolina are asking the Civic clubs of this state to join with them in a practical program of governmental education, designed to put the people in touch with the workings of the city, county and state government and keep them in touch with it For seven years the Institute of Government staff has been laying the groundwork for such a program, and going from city hall to city hall, county courthouse to county courthouse, and state department to state department collecting and classifying materials on the methods, practices and techniques of city, county and state government.
